# APPROVAL TO SELL PHENIX CITY CAMPUS PROPERTY

WHEREAS, The Troy University Board of Trustees, upon recommendation of the Chancellor, desires to sell property on the Phenix City Campus of Troy University known as Higginbotham Hall, Pitts Hall, the Maintenance Building and the Bookstore Building; and
