## To Name the Veterans Home in Enterprise in Memory of CSM (Ret.) Bennie G. Adkins

**WHEREAS**, TroyUniversity is proud of its manythousands of alumni **h**o served the United States **ith** honor in the armed forces; and

WHEREAS, then-Sergeant First Class (SFC) Adkins distinguished himself March 9-12, 1966 hen Camp A Shau in the Republic of Vietnam as attacked. SFC Adkins rushed through intense enemyfire and manned a mortar position defending the camp. He continued to mount a defense even hale incurring aunds from several direct hits from enemymo rtars. Upon learning that several soldiers are aunded near the center of camp, he temporarilyturned the mortar over to another soldier, ran through epoloding mortar rounds and carried several comrades to safetyBy the end of the battle SFC Adkins as h it 18 times by enemyfire.; and

WHEREAS, in 2014 CSM Adkins received a call from President Barack Obama informing him that the Distinguished Service Cross he had received for heroism in the Battle of Camp A Shau j cf "dggp"wr i tcf gf "\q"c"O gf cn'qh'J qpqt."yj g"WU00 ktkct {øu'j ki j guv'f geqtcvqp."y j keh as presented to him September 15, 2014; and
